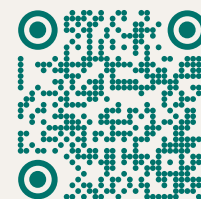
revival, a solid grasp on the truth of God's Word is essential to ground us in the fundamentals of Christian living so that we encounter the Spirit of God as our source of strength.

STUDY OPTIONS

Across our multiple years we offer many different study options that cater to students with different commitment and location capabilities. Our courses include:

1

FULL TIME ACCREDITED (DIPLOMA OF LEADERSHIP)

Attending in person, students commence on a full time tertiary level study commitment. After completing the year and passing all the associated assessments, students graduate with a Diploma Of Leadership. This course is available to all eligible Australian Students and qualifies for Fee Help / Study Assist. The Full time accredited course is currently not available for international students. Successful completion is

required to progress to accredited second year study and bachelor level in the third year.

This course is a great opportunity for those wishing to be equipped for revival practically as well as receive a recognised certificate of study.

Diploma of Leadership is Accredited by PlanetShakers College Online and the Sydney College of Divinity

FULL TIME AUDITED

Within the Glory City Academy Full time Audited Course students engage in all the same classes, content, and college activities as our accredited students, however the assessment schedule is scaled back. Students graduate the course with a Certificate of Completion and become eligible to participate in our second year, audited course. The course is ineligible for Fee Help/Study Assist, and participants are required to pay for

participation in the course. We have early registration discounts and payment plans available to make this achievable. The course is available to Australian and international students.

This course is perfect for those seeking to deepen their faith, be equipped for revival but without the pressure of tertiary grade assessments.

ONLINE ACCREDITED (DIPLOMA OF LEADERSHIP)

Within the online accredited course, students participate in all of the elements of the In person accredit course (with the exception worship, connection groups and multiply) but receive the relative flexibility to self manage their schedule. Students are required to complete all of the assessments to graduate with a Diploma of Leadership. This course options is available to all eligible australian students and is Fee Help / Study Assist approved. Online students are

invited to join the in person students in attendance at retreats and on missions as well as at graduation at their own cost.

This is a great option for students who need flexibility in their study but still wish to be equipped for revival with a recognised certificate.

Diploma of Leadership is Accredited by PlanetShakers College Online and the Sydney College of Divinity

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ONLINE AUDIT

Within the online audited course, students participate in all of the elements of the In person audit course (with the exception worship, connection groups and multiply) but receive the relative flexibility to self manage their schedule. Students also complete a scaled back assessment load and at the completion of the year graduate with a Certificate of Completion. Like the online audited option, Online students

are invited to join the in person students in attendance at retreats and on missions as well as at graduation at their own cost. Course costs are the total responsibility of the student.

This is a great option for students who need flexibility in their study but still wish to be equipped for revival, practically

ONLINE SHORT COURSE

Our Online short course program is a program by which students elect single courses to engage in on an audited level. Students can elect the number of courses they wish to complete at their own pace. The short course option is ideal for those seeking to receive training in specific areas of study. The courses are affordable and

assessment is optional These course are available to Australian and International Students.

COMPONENTS



WORSHIP

Our weekly worship sessions foster the growth of an intimate and personal connection with the Holy Spirit through the act of worship. Students cultivate an appreciation for God's presence through moments of encounter, prayer, worship and communion. Through regular participation students establish worship as a cornerstone in their lives, nurturing a strong foundation for their spiritual walk.

COMBINED CONNECTION GROUPS

Connection groups for an inclusive setting for students to develop and nurture healthy relationships with one another. These small groups establish the initial support and care structure for students as they journey through their time at the Glory City Academy. Managed and guided by students, these groups serve as a precious space for the application of relational, pastoral and leadership skills, contributing to student growth and development.

INTRODUCTION TO CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP

Developing on the skills and knowledge learnt in Transformational Leadership students now pursue knowledge in developing good leadership that will serve them in their life in ministry, as well as in their place of influence. Students explore the foundations of leadership building practical skills that will serve them well in the modern day context.

GUEST LECTURERS

A space where guests of the Academy are given the opportunity to share and minister to the student body as a whole. Through these invited guests, students receive teaching and ministry from individuals with vast experience, adding dynamically to their spiritual growth and development.

INTRODUCTION TO CHRISTIAN DOCTRINE

This fundamental theological unit establishes a strong foundation for the spiritual and personal growth of our students. Through the examination of scripture, students strengthen their faith through their deepened understanding of key theological concepts such as the atonement, Christ's death and resurrection, righteousness, healing, the supernatural and much more.

FOUNDATIONS OF PRAYER AND INTERCESSION

Foundations of Prayer and Intercession seeks to develop and deepen the intimate relationship with the Holy Spirit through the practice and discipline of prayer. It seeks to establish the practice and discipline of prayer corporately, and individually, as a basis for transformation in the lives of the students.





SURVEY OF THE OLD AND NEW TESTAMENT

Through the examination of the Old and New Testaments, students are equipped with tools and strategies to read and interpret the scriptures in a relevant manner. Taken across the whole year, this course creates lifelong students of the word who are competent in understanding the scriptures and applying its lessons to their lives, in partnership with the Holy Spirit. Students emerge as ones who understand the integrity, authority and power of the bible, equipped with sound and repeatable strategies for scriptural interpretation.

PERSON AND WORK OF THE HOLY SPIRIT.

In this unit students engage in the study of the person of the Holy Spirit and His multiple expressions, as well as the centrality of the work of the Spirit in the lives of contemporary charismatic believers. Students examine the diverse manifestations of the Spirit from a biblical perspective and partner these perspectives with practical applications.

COMMUNITY IMPACT

Further to our Multiply unity, Community Impact imparts practical skills to actively influence the local community be it in a spiritually or socially responsible way. The subject imparts theoretical lessons, paired with practical activations and partnerships with various community organisations or student led initiatives. Students learn to serve the community out of love for humanity and to be a simple blessing upon the earth.

KINGDOM WORLDVIEW

Kingdom Worldview shapes and encourages students' beliefs around the concepts of revival, and the outpouring of the Spirit of God on the earth. This subject addresses the biblical authority and how this impacts our worldview, the increasing Kingdom, the centrality of the church to God's plan for the world, as well as signs, wonders and miracles and healing.

MULTIPLY AND MULTIPLY ACTIVATIONS.

In the "Multiply" evangelism unit, students are equipped with the knowledge and skills to collaborate with the Holy Spirit and harness their individual spiritual gifts, enabling them to proficiently convey the Gospel of Jesus to diverse audiences, be it family, friends, or strangers. These skills are refined and put into practice through weekly outreach into the local community through our multiply activations unit.

LIFE WITH THE SPIRIT

Life with the Spirit establishes a value for the Spirit and the Presence of God in the lives of the students. Life with the Spirit is a practical unit where students learn to navigate the Anointing, and differentiate the voice of the Father from with their internal voice. This produces students who value the Presence of the Lord and develop a deep life with the Spirit.



HEBREWS

This unit is an insightful and practical look in to the writings contained within the book of Hebrews. Through their recent learnings students put into practice the biblical studies principals they have been equipped with in the intention of strengthening their interpretations skills through practical application and at the same time reinforcing the foundations of their theology. Hebrews is a hugely beneficial subject that equips students with the tool and passion for a lifetime of fruitful scriptural interpretation.

THE PURPOSE OF THE PROPHETIC

Building on Semester 1, students will study the work and movement of the Holy Spirit expressed through the gift of prophecy. They will learn how the prophetic operates and its roll in the earth today. Students will participate in activations that will increase their confidence and ability in hearing the voice of God as they grow as a prophetic community.

BASICS OF PASTORAL PREACHING AND COMMUNICATIONS

This unit up skills the Student in all aspects of communications, particularly those needed for work within the ministry and pastoral environments. Students are taught to become more aware of how they present themselves and, most importantly, how to interact with the people around them. Students will learn that the mechanics of fruitful communication greatly changes how they view the world and relationships. They also will gain a well-rounded knowledge of communication skills to effectively steer the Church and others toward God's purpose, design, and mission both personally and publically.

SUPERVISED MINISTRY

Practical Ministry Training is a subject that equips students with the basic skills and knowledge needed to function in ministry. This includes training in skills such as, praying for the sick, ministering deliverance, having healthy pastoral conversations, baptisms, responding to altar calls and new salvations. This subject also covers practical skills such as leading and guiding a home group, using a microphone and basic use of a sound system. Furthermore students participate in the work of the ministry in an area of their choosing, resulting in hands-on, practical experience.

TRANSFORMATIONAL LEADERSHIP

Through Transformational Leadership, students are empowered with a comprehensive set of teachings aimed at fostering spiritual, personal and emotional growth positioning them for further growth in leadership and influence in their worlds. The students will develop skills that will promote health in all aspects of their lives-physically, emotionally, mentally, and spiritually contributing to their overall well being.



APPLICATION & INTERVIEW PROCESS

CONFIRMATION

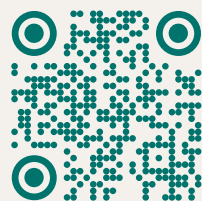
- Applicants will be sent a formal letter confirming their outcome within two weeks of their interview or no later than **no later than the 31st January, in their year of intended study.**

COMPONENTS



WORSHIP

Our weekly worship sessions foster the growth of an intimate and personal connection with the Holy Spirit through the act of worship. Students cultivate an appreciation for God's presence through moments of encounter, prayer, worship and communion. Through regular participation students establish worship as a cornerstone in their lives, nurturing a strong foundation for their spiritual walk.

COMBINED CONNECTION GROUPS

Connection groups for an inclusive setting for students to develop and nurture healthy relationships with one another. These small groups establish the initial support and care structure for students as they journey through their time at the Glory City Academy. Managed and guided by students, these groups serve as a precious space for the application of relational, pastoral and leadership skills, contributing to student growth and development.

REVIVAL HISTORY

Revival History is an inspiring look into the history of the Church with the goal of providing students with perspective and practical lessons that will encourage them in their personal walks with the Lord.

GUEST LECTURERS

A space where guests of the Academy are given the opportunity to share and minister to the student body as a whole. Through these invited guests, students receive teaching and ministry from individuals with vast experience, adding dynamically to their spiritual growth and development.

MINISTRY ESTABLISHMENT AND GOVERNANCE

Ministry Establishment and Governance covers the practical aspects of ministry and business establishment. This course provides an introduction to the complexities of starting a ministry or business, and positioning it well for success. This course runs parallel with the Ministry Project subject where students identify an area of interest and begin to practically see this dream or vision come to life.

APPLIED PRAYER AND INTERCESSION

Building on the concepts and practice learnt in the first year, Applied Prayer and Intercession seeks to further cultivate and enhance a profound connection with the Holy Spirit by immersing students in the practice and discipline of prayer. Students are equipped further with tools and strategies that will enhance their prayer lives while putting these tools into practice on a regular basis. Prayer and Intercession are further solidified as a foundation in the lives of our students.



NEHEMIAH - LEADERSHIP PRINCIPALS

This subject is an insightful look into the Old Testament book of Nehemiah from a leadership perspective. Using biblical principles and scriptural interpretation techniques, the students learn to engage in an experiential journey unpacking biblical leadership lessons that apply to today's modern context.

PASTORAL CARE - PRACTICE AND APPLICATION

This course provides an overview of the various care ministries for the local church and the procedures for implementing and growing these ministries. Emphasis will be on collaborative learning experiences so that students can learn ways to care effectively for church members and the community.

MULTIPLY ACTIVATIONS

Multiply Activations is the practical application of the theoretical concepts learned in Multiply. This is a practical space where people actively practice evangelism, praying for the sick, and the prophetic. Multiply Activations are facilitated by the 2nd year students and provide a valuable space to implement pastoral and leadership skills. Students will learn how to move with the Holy Spirit and flow in their gifting while effectively sharing the Gospel of Jesus with strangers.

GLOBAL MISSIONS

Global Missions provides insight into the importance of missions, and more importantly having a missional outlook. Students will be educated on the concepts and techniques needed to successfully impact society and communities both locally and globally. Students will understand the Father's heart for global missions, thus developing a missional outlook for life.

PREACHING AND COMMUNICATION TECHNIQUES AND APPLICATION

Developing on the tools and techniques learnt in First Year at the Academy, this subject seeks to develop the public speaking skills of the students. Learning the intricacies of sermon preparation and development, and keys to successful presentation and delivery, students are equipped with the fundamental skills to confidently speak in front of a group of people.

PROPHETIC PRACTICE

Prophetic Practice focuses on the maturation of the prophetic gift within each student. Building on the basics of the gift of prophecy, students will outwork what they have learned in the first year stream and learn how to grow in spiritual authority as a prophetic community. Students will also dive deeper into the mysteries of the Spirit and further discover how the Spirit realm operates.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT AND STRATEGY

Leadership Development and Strategy is a course that crystallises key leadership skills and knowledge in the minds of students. The leadership techniques and skills taught in this subject build upon all the leadership principals taught thus far at the Academy.



HEBREWS

This unit is an insightful and practical look in to the writings contained within the book of Hebrews. Through their recent learnings students put into practice the biblical studies principals they have been equipped with in the intention of strengthening their interpretations skills through practical application and at the same time reinforcing the foundations of their theology. Hebrews is a hugely beneficial subject that equips students with the tool and passion for a lifetime of fruitful scriptural interpretation.

PRISON EPISTLES

The Prison Epistles (Ephesians, Philipians, Colossians and Philemon) are rich New Testament books that are dense with revelation that impact the believers walk of faith. Students receive an impartation through teaching these revelations and are invited into a deeper understanding of these portions of the biblical text. Students are encouraged to take what is taught and apply it to their daily lives.

SOCIETAL INFLUENCE

How can we defend our faith in a post-modern, post-Christian world? This is what Societal Influence exists to discuss and answer. This stream engages the heart of the Gospel for answers to the criticisms and challenges that Christianity faces today.

MINISTRY PROJECT

The Ministry Project stream is the practical application of lessons learned in Ministry Establishment and Governance and other leadership-based subjects. Working together, students will dream, conceptualise and begin working on the development of a ministry project. This subject will see the creation of concepts and ideas, ministries and businesses that will continue beyond life at the Academy.

PROPHETIC EQUIPPING

In the pursuit of love, students will participate in the practice of prophecy to see the Body of Christ built up. They will learn and actively engage in the role of prophecy in the area of leadership development, ministry implementation and the equipping of the saints. They will also continue to build and function as a prophetic community growing in authority, love and powers.

ROMANS

Using techniques learned in the First Year, students engage in an experiential study of Romans. Undergirded with scriptural exposition giving students a deeper understanding into the historical situation of 1st century christianity and some of the issues facing the emerging church. Students energy with a deeper understanding of the person of Jesus resulting in real world, personal transformation and application.





INTERNSHIP

INTERNSHIP VISION

The internship seeks to provide meaningful and developmental ministry experiences, designed to build self-directed, Spirit-led, and highly capable leaders who embrace God’s call to advance His Kingdom.

ANTICIPATED OUTCOMES

The following two anticipated outcomes reflect the desire for the Internship program to provide a mutually beneficial experience for the Intern and the Intern Leader.

Outcome One: Intern Growth and Development
Internships allow interns to further their growth through serving both in areas of personal interest and areas of identified need. Interns will gain exposure to a number of leadership opportunities as well as gaining invaluable interpersonal and self-management skills.

At the conclusion of the internship, it is anticipated that interns will be prepared spiritually, emotionally, and skillfully, to lead in a variety of contexts. They will be humble, teachable, and have an exceptional work ethic. Their vision and goals will be set on Kingdom advancement over personal ministry milestones.

Whilst knowing who they are and what they are called to, interns will be willing to start low and serve hard. They will be self motivated and demonstrate the ability to overcome setbacks and hurdles through personal time in prayer and an unshakable grounding of faith in God.

Outcome Two: Leadership Development Pathway
Internships provide a unique opportunity for Intern Leaders to develop skills in training, equipping and releasing. Leading interns also promotes a growth mindset where leaders are seeking to multiply their skills and knowledge.

Core values and culture are firmly established through the completion of the Academy's first and second years before being refined through real life scenarios and environments. This provides a three-year process for identifying and empowering emerging leaders. Over this test of time, their consistency of character and integrity should be made clearly evident, thus allowing for informed decisions to be made about identifying potential leaders.

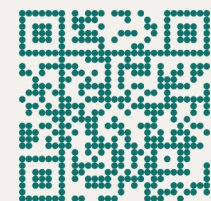

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

Accredited Course Academic Requirements

The accredited course assessment requirements are similar to the requirements of tertiary education. Students will be required to demonstrate competence and understanding surrounding the subject topics through the submission of assessments for each subject. Examples of these assessments include essay writing, book reviews and reflections, presentations etc.

There are four accredited units that contribute to the qualification per semester. These accredited units have between 3-4 pieces of assessment that students are required to complete. Students should be expecting to write the equivalent of 4000 words in assessment per accredited unit. Accredited course students should be prepared to schedule time outside of class to prepare and complete these required assessment pieces.

This retreat is held at the end of the year for one week. This is a time of celebration and sharing what God has done, and it's also a chance to commission the students for the next season they will move into. Our end of year retreat is always a highlight for students and leaders alike as we reflect and share testimonies of everything God has done throughout the year.

MISSION TRIPS

Building upon the foundational pillar of Increase, Academy mission trips are one valuable expression of active evangelism and community impact. During these trips, students form amazing bonds, spread the Gospel, actively love, and get to put into practice the amazing growth and equipping they are receiving throughout the Academy year.

Each year, several options are usually available for students to choose from and most trips are held

during the June/July mid-year break. They are generally 1-2 weeks long, range from \$500-\$3500, and are either local, national, or international.

Students are responsible for all costs of the mission trips and are encouraged to save prior to commencement, as we have very specific fundraising policies (discussed during orientation week) in order to respect our community. Payments are due late April to early May depending on the nature of the trip.

PASTORAL CULTURE AND SUPPORT

We place a high value on supporting students pastorally throughout their time at the Academy.

We passionately believe in developing a pastoral culture where our students are equipped to support and encourage one another.

With an incredible pastoral team, students will have access to various levels of support. From time to time, some students may require some pastoral support to help them process circumstances in their personal lives or things that come up at the Academy. As an initial point of contact, students will have their Connection Group Facilitators who are mentored

directly by our Pastoral Team to assist students with areas of concern.

If the pastoral concern requires a higher level of support, our Academy Pastoral Team is available to provide one-on-one sessions with students.

These sessions are offered to all students, however, the number of sessions a student has is determined by the level of time the Pastoral Team assesses is necessary on a case by case basis. If the student requires ongoing counselling beyond what the Academy has included as part of its pastoral support, this can be organised for the student in their own time and at their expense.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS AND VISAS
